Project and position description	The position concerns the Kashubian case study within the MULTI-LING project that explores multi-level dimensions of historical and contemporary multilingualism: (1) the presence of individual multilingualism in local and regional settings; (2) the characteristics and dynamics of such multilingual settings, in other words, societal multilingualism. The fundamental aim of the project is to reconstruct, explain and better understand the mechanisms and causality of the processes behind the emergence, continuity, reduction and loss (as well as possible re-emergence) of multilingualism in differing historical, geographical,

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	social, political and cultural contexts. The project will embrace historical and contemporary multilingual milieux from four regions relevant for understanding the causal frameworks underlying multilingual trajectories: selected historical multilingual hotspots from Central-Eastern Europe, Mesoamerica, South Africa and the Archipelago of Vanuatu. The case studies also offer a novel possibility to study the 'invisibility' of multilingualism and uncover its neglected history(ies). A multidisciplinary approach will combine historical and present data, qualitative and quantitative methods as well as mathematical modeling, data-driven mapping and GIS mapping.

Deep knowledge of the current situation of the Kashubian language and its speakers as well as the area of language and educational policy in

Purpose and legal grounds of data processing
