in the field of contemporary English Literature

The competitive selection process is open for all individuals who meet the requirements set out in Articles 113 and 116.2.4) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science, and who meet the following eligibility criteria according to § 166 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University:

- 1) Holding at least a Master's degree, Master of Science degree or an equivalent degree;
- 2) Exhibiting aptitude for research work;
- 3) Being prepared for carrying out teaching work.

Additionally:

4) in the two years before the opening date of the competitive selection process they were not employed under an employment contract at the Jagiellonian University.

An ideal candidate should:

- have academic achievements in the field of contemporary literature which include scholarly articles published in high-ranking journals or edited monographs, as well as papers presented at conferences at home and abroad,
- have at least 5 publications in the field of contemporary literature in journals scored on the ministerial lists, or in books issued by publishers from the ministerial lists,
- have a track record of editing or co-editing academic publications,
- have a track record of international cooperation (e.g. internships, exchanges, scholarships abroad),
- have experience in grant application or participation in research projects,
- have experience in teaching in the field of English Studies at least at the BA level,
- hold a PhD degree in English Literature, or have submitted a doctoral dissertation in English Literature (a certificate from the degree-granting institution is required) will be an asset.

Period of employment: 33 months

- 3. personal questionnaire filled in by the candidate,
- 4. copy of the PhD diploma or a certificate confirming that the doctoral dissertation has been submitted and is under review.
- 5. list of the candidate's academic achievements, including: authored publications (including the publishers, page numbers, and the ministerial score if applicable), list of edited volumes, list of conference presentations, information about grants or research projects in which the candidate took part (if applicable), research visits abroad, scholarships or awards,
- 6. details of the candidate's teaching experience (courses taught),
- 7. description of the candidate's experience in organisational work,
- 8. two letters of recommendation,
- 9. a declaration affirming that the Jagiellonian University will be the candidate's primary place of work, should they be selected in the competitive selection process,
- 10. declaration under Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science,
- 11. declaration on acknowledging and accepting the rules and regulations concerning intellectual property, management and commercialisation in force at the Jagiellonian University,
- 12. information regarding processing of personal data.

Personal data processing information for job applicants

According to Article 13 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation – hereinafter GDPR), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

- 1. The Administrator of your personal data is the Jagiellonian University with its registered office in Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, respresented by the Rector of UJ.
- 2. The Jagiellonian University appointed the Data Protection Officer www.iod.uj.edu.pl, Gołębia 24, 30-007 Kraków. The Officer can be contacted by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or at the telephone number 12 663 12 25.
- 3. Your personal data will be processed in order to:
 - a. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the advertisement as part of the legal obligation of the Administrator pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR in connection with the Polish Labour Code;
 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the advertisement based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator. The consent to the processing of personal data concerns data that you voluntarily provide as part of your CV, which do not result from Polish Labour Code.
- 4. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the law (it applies to personal data processed under Article 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR). Failure to provide you personal data will result in your inability to take part in the recruitment process. Submission of personal data processed on the basis of consent (Article 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR) is voluntary.
- 5. Your data will be processed during the recruitment period. In the event of not concluding the contract with you, your data will be deleted after the recruitment process.
- 6. You have the right of access to the content of your personal data, as well as the right to correct, delete, restrict processing, transfer, object to processing on the terms and conditions set out in the GDPR.
- 7. If the processing is based on consent, you have the right to withdraw the consent at any time, which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given before the withdrawal. - 8. Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision making or profiling.
- 9. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the Inspector General for the Protection of Personal Data, if you feel that the processing of your personal data violates the GDPR regulations.
